

A GOLD Coast surf club that was once so broke it couldn't even pay the barman will unveil a seven-figure sponsorship today.

The deal is set to make life-saving powerhouse BMD Northcliffe, the reigning world and Australian champions, even more powerful.

Northcliffe's naming right's backer, consti-

The new deal is believed to be worth as much as \$200,000 a year.

It will be announced ahead of the club's annual fund-raising lunch which has also raised more than \$2m for the club since it was started 36 years ago by Northcliffe patron Terry Jackman.

Mr Jackman, an iconic Gold Coast businessman who made his fortune in cinemas

lunch because the club was so broke it couldn't even pay the barman, who was the only employee back then," he recalled.

"We raised a bit of money and the club has been going from strength to strength ever since."

"Some people have a go at us and call us 'Cashcliffe' but when I walked in, we were as broke as any other surf club."

THE NRL finals are ready to make a splash. After two weeks of finals in regional Queensland, more than 100,000 footy fans are expected to flock to Suncorp Stadium in Brisbane for the final three games of the season in the next fortnight.

The October 3 grand final is already on track for a sellout, while this weekend's preliminary finals are set to attract a combined 50,000 across two days in a blockbuster climax.

The huge crowds come as the competition reaches the business end of the season after last

weekend's semi-finals were played in front of much smaller crowds in Mackay while Townsville, Rockhampton and the Sunshine Coast hosted games in week 1.

This weekend, both Friday night's Rabbitohs vs Manly and Saturday's Storm vs Panthers showdown, are on track to sell

about 25,000 tickets. Neither game is likely to top the 37,000 turnout which watched the Storm take down the Raiders in last year's premiership, but NRL officials are happy with early ticket sales, particularly with the grand final the following weekend already tracking for a sellout.

The NRL premiership trophy continued its tour of duty in Queensland on Wednesday, hitting the beach on the Gold Coast with champion lifesavers Riley Fitzsimmons and Georgia Miller and some enthusiastic Northcliffe Nippers, before being presented to the grand final winners at Suncorp.

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REPORTS

MANAGER OF LIFE SAVING AND EDUCATION REPORT

BMD Northcliffe Surf Club's constitution reads that as a club we will "conduct, encourage, promote, advance and control surf lifesaving at Northcliffe Beach "and for the 2021/22 season we have certainly delivered.

From Saturday 17th September 2021 until Monday 2nd May we have conducted 150 patrols on our beach with our volunteers clocking up 11487 hours between the flags.

Our training team delivered 10 skills maintenance/proficiency sessions, 61 Bronze Medallions, 18 Surf Rescue Certificates, 82 First Aid, 83 Resuscitation, 16 Advanced Resuscitation, 10 IRB crew, 7 IRB driver and 1 new IRB Training Officer awards.

8 of our active members have been nominated for the National Medal: The National Medal recognises long and diligent service (15 years minimum) by members of recognised government and voluntary organisations that risk their lives or safety to protect or assist the community in enforcement of the law or in times of emergency or natural disaster. They are awarded by the Governor-General. That is over 450 hours of voluntary service per person for our club – an exceptionally generous donation of these member's time.

We were once again fortunate to be the recipients of several grants which have delivered vital equipment for us to continue our work on the beach: an IRB

motor, IRB beach trailer, new racks for IRB storage, tool storage bench, rescue tubes, rescue boards and most recently funds for a refurbishment of our ladies' surf club bathrooms.

There was much activity, and noise, this year while the reception area and surf club staff offices were refurbished. We now have such amazing work spaces for the staff. Many of our roles in the surf club are intertwined and I thank every single one of the professional staff for your support of lifesaving this season. Our Lifesaving Committee had a few new faces this year and thanks to you all for your assistance in delivering the best lifesaving service that we possibly could.

Finally, I would like to share the words of a mother who was successfully rescued along with her two young daughters. With the girls safely loaded into ambulances she came over to us to express her gratitude. "What do I say to people who have just saved the lives of my children?" She could not find the words that could adequately do this. This is how important our work is here at Northcliffe Surf Club.

I hope everyone has a well-deserved Winter break and we look forward to seeing you all on the beach in September.

VP LIFESAVING REPORT

With another season of volunteer beach patrols completed, it's time to reflect on the season we had and the tremendous job all of our members did in maintaining a safe environment for all of the visitors that attended our beach.

I couldn't be more proud of how as a club we rallied when dealing firstly with the Delta strain of covid but then around Christmas and the New Year Omicron ran rampant through the community and decimated our patrol numbers. To all of our patrol captains and trainers who take on these incredibly important roles, thank you for your support throughout the season.



A big thankyou to our unsung heroes the Officials, IRB Drivers/Crews, Team Managers and workforce who





FINANCIAL REPORT

VP FINANCE REPORT

Over 2021/22 year, BMD Northcliffe again delivered a positive commercial result and remains in a solid financial position. However, despite the good results, operationally the year was again impacted by COVID, floods and adverse weather conditions.

Looking at financial performance, the club delivered a surplus of \$1,068,358 (previous year surplus \$768,496). The main contributors to this result were the increase in Supporters Club donations (up \$950,000) and sponsorship and fundraising revenue (up \$59,830). These revenue increases were offset by additional costs in employee expenses (up \$32,498) and depreciation charges (up \$144,770). Pleasingly, interest costs reduced by \$29,773.

The club balance sheet remains solid with a net asset position of \$5.256 million (last year \$4.188 million). Cash levels continue to remain sound at \$365,442.

In addition, BMD Northcliffe has continued to invest in upgrading and maintaining our biggest asset, our club, spending over \$2.5 million in renovations over the course of the year.

A special mention to our professional and hard-working finance, administration and supporter's teams led by Karen Markus, Lee Vrolyks and Lauren Hinds. Their commitment to the club is outstanding and they have made the club operate efficiently and effectively. In April, Karen left the organisation after 8 years of wonderful service and we welcomed Linda Bergesen to the club and look forward to her contribution in the finance area.

As this is my last year as Vice President Finance after five (5) interesting but challenging years, I would like to pass on my personal vote of thanks to the management committees of the Surf Club and Supporters Club who diligently review and discuss the financial aspects of the respective entities and ensure we continue to be a successful and sustainable club. Your input and support has been appreciated and valued.

I look forward to next year where the club will continue to advance from our stable financial position.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2022

The financial report covers Northcliffe Surf Life Saving Club Inc ('the Club') as an individual Association. The Club is a not-for-profit Association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act (QLD) 1981 (as amended by the Associations Incorporation and Other Legislation Amendment Act (QLD) 2007) ('the Act'), registered and domiciled in Australia.

The functional and presentation currency of the Club is Australian dollars.

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

Note 1 Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Management Committee ('the Committee'), the Club is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors, AASB 1048 Interpretation of Standards and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements and material accounting policies all comply with the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

Note 2 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

a. Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

When the Club receives operating grant revenue, donations or contributions, it assesses whether

there is a contract, the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance with AASB 15. When these conditions are satisfied, the Club:

- identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant, donation, bequest or contribution.
- recognises a contract liability, if applicable, for its obligations under the agreement; and recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the Club:

- recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards;
- recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

Sponsorship income is recorded when the agreement between the Club and the sponsor has been settled and invoice is raised. This income is derived by the Club's Fundraising Manager and recorded on invoice raised.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

b. Income Tax

The Club is a charitable institution for the purposes of Australian taxation legislation and is therefore exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

c. Volunteer Services

No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

d. Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost accumulated depreciation, except for buildings under Buildings & Leasehold Improvements which are carried at fair value.

The carrying amount / fair value of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the Committee members to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation of reserves in equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statements. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount

of the asset charged to the income statement and depreciation based on the assets' original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings. The Club received a valuation from the insurer in the current period and performs external valuations every three years.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Entity, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Buildings & Building Improvements	5% - 20%
Furniture & Fixtures	5% - 33%
Motor Vehicles	15% - 25%
Gear & Equipment	10% - 33%
Office & Computer Equipment	25% - 40%

e. Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

f. Provisions

Provision is made for the Club's liability for employee benefits, those benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Provisions are recognised when the Club has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

g. Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises of cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowing in current liabilities on the Statement of Financial Position.

h. Trade and Other Receivables

Trade and Other Receivables include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

i. Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expenses.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

j. Financial Instruments

Recognition and Initial Measurement

Financial instruments, incorporating financial assets and financial liabilities, are recognised when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instruments.

Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs where the instrument is not classified as at fair value through profit or loss.

Transaction costs related to instruments classified as at fair value through profit or loss are expensed to profit or loss immediately. Financial instruments are classified and measured as set out below.

Classification and Subsequent Measurement

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Financial liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities are recognised at amortised cost, comprising original debt less principal payments and amortisation.

k. Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Club during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

l. Economic Dependence

The Club is dependent on the Northcliffe SLSC Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet its financial commitments. At the date of this report the

Committee has no reason to believe the Northcliffe SLS Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support the Club.

Note 3 Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The Committee make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

Key Estimates - Provisions

As described in the accounting policies, provisions are measured at management's best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period. These estimates are made taking into account a range of possible outcomes and will vary as further information is obtained.

Key Estimates - Receivables

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. The impairment provision is based on the best information at the reporting date.
