MANAGER OF LIFE SAVING & EDUCATION REPORT

Season 2019/20 came to end in a manner that was not what we were used to. For most of us, our everyday lives were disrupted in one way or another and it was no different for our patrolling members on the beach. Moving to "Level 3 surveillance" from Saturday 28th March until season end on Monday 4th May, our red and yellow flags came down as we operated with minimal patrol numbers. 70% of our members were asked to stay at home and not attend their rostered patrols. And our annual "End of Season BBQ" had to be postponed.

However, there is plenty of Northcliffe's season 2019/20 to be extremely proud of:

Over 300 of our active members donated 11960 extremely valuable hours to our club to ensure our beach was a safe location for both locals and visitors. Our nearly 1000 preventative actions are why we only needed to log in 8 rescues on our watch.

Our training team assisted our members to complete 1009 new awards, this is essentially an investment in our club's development. In addition, they conducted 6 skills maintenance/proficiency sessions with 1789 awards being assessed to ensure our members are always "rescue ready" and up to date with any changes. Our IRB training program went from strength to strength with 12 new drivers and 22 new crew members coming on board.

But none of this happens without "our people" and so I wish to firstly thank all our patrolling members for your generosity of time and commitment. There really is no way of measuring the times we all taught, mentored or supported each other. These "unmeasurables" are really what makes us a great club through these tough times.

It really is a team effort with the professional staff in the office and I thank you all for your support, co-operation and fun times whilst we got the job done. And to the Lifesaving Committee for their efforts in ensuring that our primary purpose of our presence on the beach is always the first priority.

Finally, I wish to personally thank the Club Committees for their unwavering support to us all over recent months. Keeping the club open and available to our members in a somewhat reduced capacity was a lifeline to many. I think that we really do have a whole new appreciation of what our club means to us.

It's now time to look forward to Season 2020/21. We are already planning our patrol teams and training/course schedules and I encourage everyone to upskill to further strengthen not only your own patrol but ultimately your club. Enjoy your winter break as September will be here before we know it, we can't wait!


To our Lifesaving and Management Committees thank you for your unwavering commitment to ensure that we are well equipped to handle our Lifesaving duties to the highest possible standard.



CLUB HOUSE DIRECTORS REPORT



YOUTH DEVELOPMENT COORDINATOR REPORT

When I took the role as Youth Development Coordinator in March 2019 I had no idea how the next year was going to play out, but I guess no one else would have predicted how the season was going to end either!

It was a very steep learning curve, trying to absorb as much knowledge as possible before Tiarne left for the Queensland Fire and Emergency Service, and the first major hurdle for the season was our Sign on Days. This season we decided to run three Sign on Days, with one of them run at the Miami Aquatic Centre – with the hopes that this may bring in new families that live further south of the club. The addition of the third Sign on Day along with promotion of our Nipper program to schools and other near-by community sport clubs, we saw our membership numbers grow to 355 – 50 more members than the previous season.

With the absence of Tiarne in the coaching team alongside Chris Redler, we were blessed to have Imogen Rees join the junior team. Chris and Imogen had a small but dedicated squad who enjoyed improving on their surf skills. Gavin Hill coached the U14-17s again this season, this time joined by Caine Eckstein. Together they guided the youth's to some great results at the few carnivals that were held. Emma Rynne had a strong season coaching the beach area with some good results.

Our U8-10s attended the Lil' Squirts ocean and beach carnivals, and then took on Branch Championships at Burleigh Heads in February. It was great to see some of our youngest nippers giving it a red hot go, with some good finals results. Our U11-15s had a more difficult season, with the second half of the season being plagued with bad weather, big surf, and multiple event reschedules (3rd time's the charm for Branch Champs!). This was a frustrating time from an administration perspective, and I'm sure it was just as frustrating for all the parents and competitors. Fortunately the first half of the season went almost without interruption, with our competitors attending the Young Guns carnivals, Gold Coast Youth Championships, and Ocean 38 carnivals, with some good results across all age groups. It goes without saying that our U11s-17s (and U19s, Opens, and Masters of course)

were bitterly disappointed when the corona virus took control and left us with a season cut very short, with no State and Australian Championships to compete at.

Earlier in the season, we had 20 competitors from U13-17 represent the South Coast Branch in the Interbranch Team who competed in November 2019; Kalani Creech, Caitlin Allred, Kaia Sugars, Matt Lowe, Ryley Harland, Claudia Bailey, Alyssa Bailey, Emily Gauld, Dyana Crabb, Lucas Miller, Euan Lynch, Jeremy Kneen, Asher Ward, Madeline Allars, Caitlyn Miller, Sara Tazaki, Ruben Rees, Kai Watson, Auden Parish, and Corbin Zahn. We also had Alyssa Bailey, Claudia Bailey, Ryley Harland, and Euan Lynch selected for the QLD Cyclones State Team to compete at Alexandra Headland in January at the Interstate Youth Pathway Cup. All competitors raced hard and should be proud of their efforts for making representative teams.

There is more to Nippers than meets the eye, and there are a lot of people that help make it happen behind the scenes. It took a moment for me to wrap my head around it all, a special thanks to all who have helped guide me in the right direction – all for the benefit of the Nipper program. Thanks to all the parents who have brought their children to our Nipper program, the parents and club members that put their hand up to help out in any capacity – Water Safety, Age Managers, Officials, Team Managers, helping to set up or pack up gear, IRB crews, and First Aid. Without everyone chipping in, our Nipper program and attendance at carnivals would not be possible. A huge thank you to Shannon Van Balen for all the hard work you have put in this season taking on a large role within the program, everyone appreciates your passion for Nippers and the Club. Thanks also to Fossil for your support as the Vice President of Youth Development.

Looking forward to the next season, hopefully it will be one that we can finish properly!

VICE PRESIDENT OF FINANCE REPORT

Andrew Moore

Over the 2019/20 operational year, BMD Northcliffe has continued to maintain a stable financial position. This is despite the final months of the year (March and April) being partly compromised by the COVID-19 situation.

The surf club delivered a deficit of \$127,747 (previous year deficit \$75,305). The main reason behind this change was a reduction in the Supporters Club donation by \$286,000 against the prior year. This decrease was offset by a reduction in surf sports costs, lifesaving costs and contractor expenses and an increase in interest expense reflecting the full year impact of our loan.

Despite the accounting deficit, the more critical measure of Earnings before Interest, Tax, Depreciation and Amortisation (EBITDA) was a surplus of \$515,160 (previous year surplus \$495,269) in the year. EBITDA measures the underlying operational performance of the organisation which again showed a positive outcome.

The club balance sheet remains a stable net asset position of \$3.419 million. Cash levels continue to remain sound.

Looking forward, at the time of writing the 2020/21 year will also be financially impacted from the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. The surf club is doing all things possible to ensure financial sustainability.

I would like to pass on my personal vote of thanks to the management committees of the Surf Club and Supporters Club who diligently review and discuss the financials of the respective entities and ensure we continue to be a successful and sustainable club.

Finally a special mention to our fantastic finance and administration teams led by Karen Markus and Lee Vrolyks who make the office run so smoothly for the benefit of the entire club. Your work is very much appreciated by all members.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Note 1 Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act Queensland 1981*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The committee have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the ACNC. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance of *AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements; AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows; AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and errors; AASB 1048 Interpretation of Standards and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures*.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historic costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

(a) Income Tax

The Northcliffe Surf Life Saving Club is a charitable institution for the purposes of Australian taxation legislation and is therefore exempt from income tax.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Property, plant and equipment is carried at cost accumulated depreciation, except for buildings under Buildings & Leasehold Improvements which are carried at fair value.

The carrying amount / fair value of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee members to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from those assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

Increases in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land and buildings are credited to a revaluation of reserves in equity. Decreases that offset previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves directly in equity; all other decreases are charged to the income statements. Each year the difference between depreciation based on the revalued carrying amount of the asset charged to the income statement and depreciation based on the assets' original cost is transferred from the revaluation reserve to retained earnings. The Club received a valuation from the insurer in the current Period and performs external valuations every three years.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable assets are:

Motor Vehicles	15%-25%
Furniture & Fixtures	5% - 33%
Gear & Equipment	10% - 33%
Office/Computer Equipment	25% - 40%
Buildings & Leasehold Improvements	5% - 20%

During the year there has been a new Motor vehicle acquired through a lease option.

(c) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

(d) Leases

Leases of PPE, where substantially all the risks and benefits incidental to the ownership of the asset (but not the legal ownership) are transferred to the association, are classified as finance leases.

Finance leases are capitalised by recording an asset and a liability at the lower of the amounts equal to the fair value of the leased property or the present value of the minimum lease payments, including any guaranteed residual values. Lease payments are allocated between the reduction of the lease liability and the lease interest expense for that period.

Leased assets are depreciated on a straight-line basis over the shorter of their estimated useful lives or the lease term. Lease payments for operating leases, where substantially all the risks and benefits remain with the lessor, are charged as expenses in the periods in which they are incurred.

(e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

(f) Cash Assets

Cash assets includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowing in current liabilities on the Statement of Financial Position.

(g) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.

(h) Revenue and Other Income

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable after taking into account any trade discounts and volume rebates allowed. For this purpose, deferred consideration is not discounted to present values when recognising revenue.

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument. Dividend revenue is recognised when the right to receive a dividend has been established.

Grant and donation income is recognised when the entity obtains control over the funds, which is generally at the time of receipt.

If conditions are attached to the grant that must be satisfied before the association is eligible to receive the contribution, recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

Fundraising and Sponsorship income is recorded when the agreement between the Surf Club and the sponsor has been settled and invoice is raised. This income is derived by the Club's Fundraising Manager and recorded on invoice raised.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax.

(i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expenses. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

(j) Financial Instruments

Recognition and Initial Measurement

Financial instruments, incorporating financial assets and financial liabilities, are recognised when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instruments. Trade date accounting is adopted for financial assets that are delivered within timeframes established by marketplace convention.

Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs where the instrument is not classified as at fair value through profit or loss. Transaction costs related to instruments classified as at fair value through profit or loss are expensed to profit or loss immediately. Financial instruments are classified and measured as set out below.

Classification and Subsequent Measurement

i) Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

ii) Financial liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities are recognised at amortised cost, comprising original debt less principal payments and amortisation.

(k) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

(l) Economic Dependence

Northcliffe Surf Life Saving Club Inc is dependent on the Northcliffe SLS Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet its financial commitments. At the date of this report the management committee has no reason to believe the Northcliffe SLS Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support Northcliffe Surf Life Saving Club Inc.

(m) Bank Loan – Security

The security for the bank loan is:

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the financial report of Northcliffe Surf Life Saving Club Inc.(the Association), which comprises the statement of financial position as at 30 April 2020, the statement of profit or loss and comprehensive income, statement of changes in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies and management committees declaration.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial report of the Association is in accordance with the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 and Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012, including;

- a) gives a true and fair view of the Association's financial position as at 30 April 2020 and of its financial performance for the year ended on that date; and
- b) complying with the accounting policies described in Note 1 and Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. The financial report has been prepared to assist Northcliffe Surf Life Saving Club Inc. to meet the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 and Division 60 of the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

Other Information

Those charged with governance are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Association's annual report for the year ended 30 April 2020, but does not include the financial report and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial report does not cover the other information and accordingly we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial report, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial report or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Responsibilities of Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Report
