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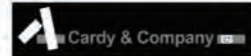

PRESIDENTS REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to report on once again, another successful year for BMD Northcliffe Surf Life Saving Club on our recently completed season 2023/24.

The most important responsibility we have here at BMD Northcliffe is to provide an essential, and sometimes an emergency service to our community as a volunteer lifesaving Club, and to ensure that it is a safe environment for all that frequent our beach, whether they be locals or the many tourists we have visit the Gold Coast in general.

This past season we had 301 volunteer members on 14 patrols providing that essential service to over 44,000 people visiting our beach, with 1254 preventative actions and 13 rescues. For everything else we provide to the community and to our members, junior activities, surf sports, licensed supporters club, lifesaving is our true purpose, the purpose our Association was formed over 100 years ago, and the purpose we are here together, and we should celebrate this! NO LIVES LOST. That's our primary goal.

Our Life Saving services have once again kept our beach fatality free, and we thank all our members that performed volunteer beach patrols this season, especially our Patrol Captains, Vice Captains and IRB Drivers/crew, that have taken on that extra level of responsibility and leadership.

Our Life Saving Committee have managed our members service admirably again this season and on behalf of all members I wish to thank Andrew McQuitty, Vice President Life Saving and Jonathan King, our Club Captain and our two Vice Club Captains, Christie Short and Scott Davies for the tireless work and countless hours on the beach ensuring that our commitment to saving lives is professionally administered.

The success of our lifesaving and education services are reliant on our professional management which is delivered by our Manager of Lifesaving & Education, Caroline Fildes, our Lifesaving Admin Assistant, Bella Williams and overseen with ongoing guidance by the Life Saving Committee. Saving lives is our primary purpose and we should all be very proud of the level of service we do provide to our members and the community we serve.

New members are often attracted to our club by the facilities and services which we offer here at BMD Northcliffe. Our Junior Activities and Surf Sports programs have been an excellent form of recruitment over the years thus ensuring a steady flow of volunteer patrolling members to our club.

Our Nipper program finished up in mid-March. We had a large increase in numbers this year with over 480 young members from under 6 to under 13. Special thanks to Trent Rowe, our Vice President Youth Development and his team, to Paul (Spoon) Wotherspoon and especially Chloe Mannix-Power in her first year as Junior Development Coordinator. They collectively have done an exceptional job. To our Junior coaches Jake (Head Nipper Coach), Bruce (Assistant Nipper Coach) and Chloe (Beach Coach), thank you for your time and professional expertise in shaping our young members. This program provides an opportunity for both children and parents to begin their involvement in Surf Life Saving.


Special mentions to Graham Adams and Tarzan Tazaki (for water safety/IRB driving/IRB crew), all the Age Managers, their assistants, water safety, IRB drivers and crew and all our members that have supported and helped in any way in the operation of such an integral part of this club.

Our Surf Sports program provides our members with opportunities to showcase their skills and talent to other members within our organization and also to the general community.

Another successful year! Winning the Queensland and Australian Champion Club titles for the 21st year in succession.

The Aussies were conducted over 3 beaches causing logistical challenges and a lot of planning by team management. We had a team of 135 members competing and countless members and staff making it all happen.





After a very long event packed season it all finished on a cold, windy and rainy day at Maroochydore on the 21st April. But the weather did not deter our success, with 22 Gold, 20 Silver, 16 Bronze and 45 minor placings, the Club remained at the top, claiming our 21st consecutive Champion Club title.

Some stand outs throughout the season for me:

In the Nutri Grain Series, over the 6 events conducted for each men and women, the Club through Georgia, Lana, Olivia, Joe and Bevy won 9 out of the 12 races, the girls winning every Nutri-Grain Series race. The final series results being a 1, 2, 3 for the girls (6 in top 10) and a 2, 3 for the boys (4 in top 10). A dominant performance.

The Shaw and Partners Financial Services Shannon Eckstein Iron Classic has become in 6 years, the pinnacle of surf sports, the most prestigious event in the country. Our event now being the ultimate decider in a wider series, its continued to produce just an incredible experience, for the athletes competing, the officials, the IRB drivers and crew, the workforce and the management team that make it all happen. Huge Surf, VIP Dinners, Fireworks, Free Ice Creams, After Party and the biggest payday in Surf Sports. It's a mammoth weekend for the Club with long hours committed in the many weeks leading into it and then during the 3 days, but it's all so worth. This event brings the Club together and we get to showcase what we can do as a committed team. Earl, without you, this experience for all of us would not be possible. Thank you to Earl Evans, Shaw and Partners Financial Services, the Summer of Surf Team and all the event sponsors.

Our results at the AUSSIES, whilst hampered sometimes by the challenging surf conditions did everyone in this Club proud. The way in which our people competed, supported each other, openly caring for each other, working together as a team, that's the Gold Medal! But special mention to Mitch Morris, 6 Gold medals at the Aussies. Not far behind him was his twin brother Jake on 5 Gold medals. Lana Rogers, her first season under the Maroon Star, taking out the Cooly Gold, The Nutri-Grain Ironwoman Series, The Shaw and Partners Financial Services Summer of Surf Ironwoman Series and the Australian Ironwoman Championship. Truly a season to remember for Lana.

Whilst we continue to have such success across all areas of sport within our Club, it's difficult to mention all results in this report, even though all your results are worthy of mention, the good, the bad and the ugly! We thank you all, for your committed professional aptitude to your chosen events and thank you for representing our Club.

The Surf Sports program under the guidance of Vice President Surf Sports, Brian Booth and Paul Wotherspoon, Manager of Youth Development have together with our coaching staff, continued to keep the club at the forefront of Surf Life Saving Competition in Australia and the World for that matter for well over 20 years now.

I would like to also show our appreciation in particular to our Surf Sports Committee, our Team Managers, Officials, IRB drivers/crew, water safety, Pop, Brian, Aaron and our Surf Sports Admin Officer, Emily Doyle, who have assisted the club during the season in the provision of our Surf Sports Program.

Our Open & Under 19 Head Coaches in Naomi Flood (Women) and Kev Morrison (Men), together with Paul Wotherspoon, Head Development Coach/ Gavin Hill for Under 14, 15 & 17, worked tirelessly together with tremendous results across all age groups throughout a very long competition season.

Since our Supporters Association (Supporters Club) was incorporated in 1991 it has continued to provide the much-needed funds to operate the Surf Club every season. In the last 33 years alone, the Supporters Club Management Committee have donated well over \$37 million to the Surf Club for its operations. That incredible amount of funds has been used wisely on a vast array of resources and services to our members and of course the community. Without that vital financial support of our Supporters Club over so many years now, we would definitely not be where we are today without it.

We are, once again, proud to report zero lives lost between the flags this season. We have had some textbook water rescues, mass rescues usually around finish time and tricky conditions which, combined with holiday crowds, has kept our volunteer lifesavers very busy. We had many first aid incidents to manage with a number requiring QAS involvement.

Our patrolling numbers were higher than ever this season, with our members completing a total of 12424 patrolling hours which is an increase on last season, which seems to be a developing trend. I extend my sincere appreciation to all our Patrol Captains, Vice Captains and IRB Drivers for taking on that extra responsibility. To our Training team, who continue to ensure our members develop the knowledge and skills required to participate confidently within their patrol team, a huge thank you. The introduction of a new learning platform this season was a real challenge at times but the team managed it admirably.

Thanks as always to our Lifesaving Committee, a group of very dedicated members who ensure that our commitment to saving lives is always forefront.

To Jonathan King, I wanted to take a moment to personally express my gratitude for your support, advice and assistance as Club Captain over the past decade. It is not an easy role but your commitment to our club, both on and off the beach, has been instrumental in our success. Several of our members represented our club at development camps and programs throughout the season including: Trent Rowe (National Leaders Masterclass), Nicky Conyngham (PULSE advanced

lifesaving program) and Kieran Farnworth (SLSQ Advanced Lifesaving Development Program). These programs provide an exciting opportunity for members to further develop their leadership skills and continue to positively contribute to the success of our club.

We were fortunate to be the recipient of several grants which have allowed us to update our IT equipment to assist with the new online learning platform introduced this season and also a new ATV, one of our most essential and used beach rescue tools.

We will be releasing our 2024/25 Course schedule very soon; this will be posted on our website and on our social media platforms. I encourage everyone to consider "upskilling", especially with First Aid, Advanced Resuscitation and IRB awards which will allow us to maintain the excellent standards of our beach patrol teams.

Whether you have served as a Patrol Captain, jumped on to other patrols, patrolled just where you could between work and other commitments, provided First Aid support, assisted with training, maintained equipment or contributed in any other capacity, your commitment has been instrumental in the smooth running of our club. You all make such an impact, on and off patrol, to those who visit our beach.

Finally, I wish to take a moment to thank David Shields and to acknowledge his remarkable service spanning three decades. Your kindness, generosity, and genuine concern for the well-being of our staff have created a supportive and nurturing environment that we are deeply grateful for. Your passion for our club and your tireless efforts have inspired us all, fostering a culture of excellence and camaraderie that will endure for years to come.

Enjoy the beautiful Winter months, keep fit and we look forward to seeing you all back on our beach in September.

Swapping sand and salt for black lines and chlorine during the months of May to August, the club had great representation in all Pool Rescue events conducted. There was lots of enthusiasm and focus on pool deck both during training and competition with everyone's passion, participation and hard training well rewarded.

The Queensland Pool Rescue Championships moved to Cairns with five males (Matt Gibbs, Kai Gilbert, Dan Miller, Lucas Miller and Corbin Zahn) and four females (Josie Christensen, Jarrah Davies, Jessica-Marie Garbanzo and Melinda Jackson) representing BMD Northcliffe. It was a small yet successful team. Corbin, Dan, Josie and Matt were joined by Lucas Miller and Cyra Bender at the Australian Royal Pool Lifesaving Championships.

A total of 50 athletes raced at the Australian Championships at Southport Aquatic Centre. This was down 20% on the previous season, mostly in the younger age groups. BMD Northcliffe came in second to Currumbin SLSC and we look forward to regaining the title in 2024. Medals included 19 individual gold, 14 silver and 9 bronze as well as countless team podium finishes. Special congratulations to Zoe Crawford who set a World Youth and Australian U19 record in the U19 Female 100m Manikin Tow in a super-fast 57.14 seconds. Zoe also set an Australian record in the U19 Female 100m Manikin Carry with Fins. Jack Keepa was rewarded with an Australian record in the U19 Male 100m Manikin Tow and Kai Gilbert set fast Australian standards in the U15 Male 100 Manikin Carry with Fins, the 100m Rescue Medley and the 50m with Fins.

Congratulations to pool rescue athletes Piper Asquith (Youth), Kai Gilbert (Youth), Naomi Scott (Open) and Cyra Bender (Open reserve) who have been named in the Australia Lifesaving Team to contend the Lifesaving World Championships on the Gold Coast in 2024. Northcliffe members have also been selected in the French, Japanese, New Zealand and South African National teams. We wish everyone all the best.

Cyra Bender, Kai Gilbert and Piper Asquith competed at the New Zealand Pool Rescue Championships as members of the Australian

Team and Daniel Miller was selected in the Australian Royal Lifesaving Development Team to compete at the Commonwealth Championships in Ontario, Canada. 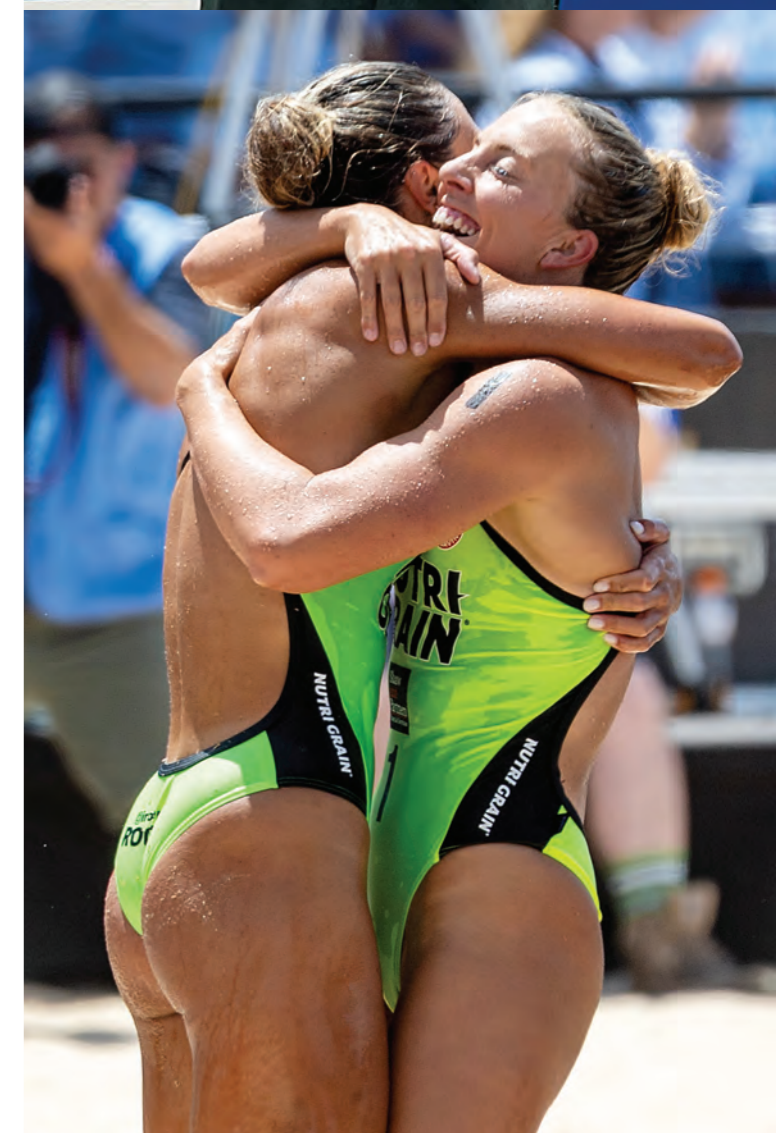

The 2023-2024 nipper season started fresh with Chloe Mannix-Power taking over as Junior Development Coordinator doing an amazing job of reforming the Sunday morning set up with Jake Nicholson. Our nipper numbers grew to 484 members and we had more involvement from nipper parents as water safety and officials, but more work needs to be done with growing nipper member numbers. Water training under Jake Nicholson and Bruce Kolkka saw many nippers develop their skills and confidence in the surf, progressing their understanding of and ability to read surf conditions. Bruce and Annie Kolkka and daughter Billie have decided to travel around Australia for a year and will be dearly missed next season. We are looking forward to announcing our new assistant coach for next year with a greater focus on competition and skill development, reforming our training structure to begin with fitness early in the season, then focus on skills during the season.

We had some great results at the QLD Youth Championships and Australian Youth Championships, doing surprisingly well in the 2km and 2 x 1km beach relay events at the state titles and Kingston Lowe winning the U15 Australian Board Race. We had our largest number of kids qualify for the state titles for a number of years and we aim to keep that number growing with a wider number of events contested next season. Many thanks go out to our coaches and officials that put in lots of time and effort to ensure our nippers are able to compete. Team selection is always a difficult job that the coaches have to do, especially when they get little opportunity to see some kids at training regularly enough.

Our end of season break up colour run was a huge success with everyone having a great time, it was a hit! Some kids had that much chalk colour in their hair that it would have taken a week to get it all out, especially Bruce who looked like papa smurf.

Our age managers were amazing this season, providing our nippers with the support and guidance they need to help them flourish. We had

more parents do their Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate to increase our water safety numbers so that we have enough coverage for Sunday nippers and at carnivals. Many thanks to our nipper committee for their time and patience. Lots of planning goes on behind the scenes to make sure that everything runs smoothly and that we have the right structure and planning for the future. We have a great committee that is committed to improving the nipper structure for skill development, education and other avenues for our nippers to succeed.

Thanks also has to go to our supporters club that provide the finances and equipment needed to run our nipper program, it is great that they are giving back to our future lifesavers.

This year the club delivered a surplus of \$839,334 (previous year surplus \$1,068,358) with the major contributors to this year's result being donations from the Supporters Club (\$2,300,000) and Sponsorship and Fundraising income (\$769,658). Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 April 2024

Reporting Entity

Northcliffe Surf Life Saving Club Inc ('the Club') is domiciled in Australia. The address of the Club's registered office is 51 Garfield Terrace, Surfers Paradise QLD 4217.

The Club is a not-for-profit association primarily involved in promoting and advancing the work of surf life-saving.

Note 1: Basis of Preparation

In the opinion of the Management Committee ('the Committee'), the Club is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*.

These special purpose financial statements have been prepared in accordance with and comply with all the recognition and measurement requirements in Australian Accounting Standards.

Disclosures required under the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012* includes:

- AASB 101 *Presentation of Financial Statements*
- AASB 107 *Statement of Cash Flows*
- AASB 108 *Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors*
- AASB 124 *Related Party Disclosures*
- AASB 1048 *Interpretations of Standards*
- AASB 1054 *Australian Additional Disclosures*.

The financial statements were authorised by the committee members on 10 June 2024.

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis. These financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is the Club's functional currency.

In preparing these financial statements, management has made judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of the Club's accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively.

Certain comparative figures have been reclassified to conform with the financial statement presentation adopted for the current year.

Notes to the Financial Statements

For the Year Ended 30 April 2024

Note 2: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

a) Economic Dependence

The Club is dependent on the Northcliffe SLSC Supporters Association Inc for funds used to meet its financial commitments. At the date of this report the Committee has no reason to believe the Northcliffe SLS Supporters Association Inc will not continue to support the Club.

b) Income Tax

The Club is a charitable institution for the purposes of Australian taxation legislation and is therefore exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

c) Volunteer Services

No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

d) Impairment of Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Committee reviews the carrying amounts of its tangible and intangible assets to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have been impaired. If such an indication exists, an impairment test is carried out on the asset by comparing the recoverable amount of the asset, being the higher of the asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use, to the asset's carrying amount. Any excess of the asset's carrying amount over its recoverable amount is recognised in the income and expenditure statement.

e) Provisions

Provision is made for the Club's liability for employee benefits, those benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Provisions are recognised when the Club has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

f) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of associated GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO). In this case it is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of the expenses.

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included with other receivables or payables in the assets and liabilities statement.

g) Financial InstrumentsRecognition and Initial Measurement

Financial instruments, incorporating financial assets and financial liabilities, are recognised when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instruments.

Financial instruments are initially measured at fair value plus transactions costs where the instrument is not classified as at fair value through profit or loss. Transaction costs related to instruments classified as at fair value through profit or loss are expensed to profit or loss immediately. Financial instruments are classified and measured as set out below.

Classification and Subsequent Measurement

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market and are stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method.

Financial liabilities

Non-derivative financial liabilities are recognised at amortised cost, comprising original debt less principal payments and amortisation.

h) Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the Club during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Note 3: Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The Committee make estimates and judgements during the preparation of these financial statements regarding assumptions about current and future events affecting transactions and balances.

These estimates and judgements are based on the best information available at the time of preparing the financial statements, however as additional information is known then the actual results may differ from the estimates.

The significant estimates and judgements made have been described below.

(i) Key Estimates - Provisions

As described in the accounting policies, provisions are measured at management's best estimate of the expenditure required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period. These estimates are made taking into account a range of possible outcomes and will vary as further information is obtained.

(ii) Key Estimates - Receivables

The receivables at reporting date have been reviewed to determine whether there is any objective evidence that any of the receivables are impaired. An impairment provision is included for any receivable where the entire balance is not considered collectible. The impairment provision is based on the best information at the reporting date.

(iii) Key estimates - Depreciation

As described by the accounting policies, an assets useful life is the estimated period of time over which future economic benefits embodied in a depreciable asset are expected to be consumed by the entity. These estimates are made taking into account assets of a similar type and nature.

Accounting Policy

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Club and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates allowed. No revenue is recognised if there are significant uncertainties regarding recovery of the consideration due or the revenue received or to be received cannot be measured reliably.

(i) Specific revenue streams

The revenue recognition policies for the principal revenue streams of the Club are:

Grant revenue, donations and contributions

When the Club receives operating grant revenue, donations or contributions, it assesses whether there is a contract, the contract is enforceable and has sufficiently specific performance obligations in accordance with AASB 15. When these conditions are satisfied, the Club:

- identifies each performance obligation relating to the grant, donation, bequest or contribution.
- recognises a contract liability, if applicable, for its obligations under the agreement; and recognises revenue as it satisfies its performance obligations.

Where the contract is not enforceable or does not have sufficiently specific performance obligations, the Club:

- recognises the asset received in accordance with the recognition requirements of other applicable accounting standards;
- recognises income immediately in profit or loss as the difference between the initial carrying amount of the asset and the related amount.

Sponsorship revenue

Sponsorship income is recorded when the agreement between the Club and the sponsor has been settled and invoice is raised. This income is derived by the Club's Fundraising Manager and recorded on invoice raised.

Interest revenue

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Other revenue

Other income is recognised on an accruals basis when the Club is entitled to it.

Accounting Policy**(i) Recognition and measurement**

Items of plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses.

When parts of an item of plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Any gain or loss on disposal of an item of plant and equipment (calculated as the difference between the net proceeds from disposal and the carrying amount of the item) is recognised in profit or loss, associated with the expenditure will flow to the Club. Ongoing repairs and maintenance are expensed as incurred.

Subsequent expenditure is capitalised only when it is probable that the future economic benefits.

(ii) Impairment

The carrying amount of the Club's plant and equipment are reviewed at each reporting date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

Depreciation

Property, plant and equipment, excluding freehold land, is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Club, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

At the end of each annual reporting period, the depreciation method, useful life and residual value of each asset is reviewed. Any revisions are accounted for prospectively as a change in estimate.
